
Warren Street*

Warren Street, originally known as Back Street, is a very old Charlestown thoroughfare - possibly the oldest street in Charlestown - dating as early as 1638. It was renamed Warren Street in honor of Gen. Joseph Warren, who was killed at the Battle of Bunker Hill.

<u>Eleven houses</u> built between the late 1830s and 1892, and two church buildings are included in the survey:

Two wood frame Federal houses (1800-1812).

Seven wood frame Greek Revival houses (late 1830-1840s).

One High Victorian Gothic/Mansard house (1871).

One wood frame late Italianate house (? 1885-92).

A Romanesqe Revival/Queen Anne Parochial School (1901-2).

A Gothic Revival Roman Catholic church (1187-92).
